

**Briefly describe in fifty words one example of intrapersonal CMC and the software or communication technology that might mediate it.**

An example of intrapersonal CMC is social networking where the presence of such tool allows for the sender to convey their inner thoughts from themselves to out in the open for (presumably positive) feedback and consolation as provided by the poster's friends via Facebook—the receivers. This model is best described as linear since the form of communication here is mediated and the posts/messages are received and decoded.

**Briefly describe in fifty words one example of linear dyadic CMC and the software or communication technology that might mediate it.**

An example of linear dyadic CMC is texting/IM where the sender is the person who initiates the conversation and the receiver, the one who accepts the initial message. Subsequently, the roles of sender and receiver will alternate between the dyad given the continued communication where such could concern obtaining information or simply connecting with one another on a personal level. This model is also linear due to the manner of texting not being simultaneous (action-reaction is delayed unlike speaking in person).

**Briefly describe one example of transactional, dyadic CMC and the software or communication technology that might mediate it.**

An example of transactional, dyadic CMC can be illustrated via radio between two people where the sender speaks out a command to the receiver who performs said command. The command that is performed is usually done simultaneously (i.e. step by step, spoken direction to completed action) which is the reason why it is transactional. In this scenario, the receiver needs to decode the sender's message either before initiating an action or while commencing it.

**Briefly describe one example of linear, public or mass CMC and software or communication technology that might mediate it.**

An example of linear public CMC can be an online video sharing website. More specifically, when utilized by educational intuitions, video sharing between an instructor (sender) and a student (receiver) is linear in that lectures recorded on video can viewed at any time or by convenience. Online classes catering to multiple students (the public) can access the videos where the communication of information is accessible at the comfort of a computer.

**Briefly describe one example of transactional, public or mass CMC and the software or communication technology that might mediate it.**

An example of transactional public CMC can be demonstrated via intercom system. One such scenario is a workstation where multiple workers (the receivers) will be ordered by a supervisor (the sender) by speaker. As organization of handling duties is key for a manager to uphold, this transactional method of communication allows for the prioritizing of goals and tasks to be

assigned per person while reducing the possibility of confusion as to who is to do what.
